MESSAGE FROM THE GARRISON

Greetings from Fort Knox! We are in the final throes of Fort Knox's largest transformation since World War II. Since the Base Realignment and Closure decisions were announced in 2005, the post has grown by roughly 2,500 Soldiers and 2,500 civilian employees and undergone almost \$1 billion in construction and renovation projects.

When I stop and reflect on how Fort Knox looked when I became the deputy garrison commander in July 2001, it's amazing realizing just how much of the infrastructure has been improved. At times, Fort Knox seems like a completely different post.

We're appropriately moving Fort Knox into the 21st century and providing quality facilities for deserving customers – Soldiers, Families, Army Civilians and Retirees.

Speaking of facilities, funding was allocated for the design of a new Fort Knox hospital. The new facility would include such elements as red brick to coincide with Fort Knox's beautiful 1930s-era historic district. Ireland Army Community Hospital here still provides quality services and great patient care, but it's 54 years old. Building a new hospital is costly at about \$1,000 a square foot, but it remains a possibility that funding may come for this construction. If it does, the new hospital would be built next to the existing hospital at the corner of Wilson Road and Spearhead Division Avenue.

Another sign of the transformation at Fort Knox lies with our increase in the number of deployable units. The 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 1st Infantry Division moved here in October 2009, and the unit's 3,500 Soldiers deployed last December for a 12-month tour to eastern Afghanistan. For perspective, this is the largest combat deployment we've had out of Fort Knox since the 1st Armored Division's in April 1942. The 3/1 IBCT is making great strides, alongside their Afghan partners, in setting the security and stability conditions necessary to begin transitioning to the Afghan government.

Our 233rd Transportation Company also deployed recently, marking their seventh deployment in the global war on terror. A good news story about both of these deployed units is the support they receive from members of the community, to include retirees. Every platoon-sized element has been "adopted" by businesses, organizations or individuals. Soldiers receive care packages – be it in the form of a letter, snacks or magazines – and the Soldiers keep in correspondence with their adopters throughout their deployment. It's special to see the bonds that have been established as a result of this effort.

The 3rd Sustainment Command (Expeditionary) is also likely to deploy within the next six to nine months. The 3rd ESC was the first major movement to Fort Knox in this round of BRAC, having come here from Germany in 2007. Since their time here, the command has deployed twice – once for a year in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, where they oversaw the entire logistics operations in that theater, and once to Haiti to lead logistics for the humanitarian aid efforts after the devastation caused there by an earthquake.

As evidenced, Fort Knox has changed from its days as primarily an armor training installation. The post is now a multi-command, multi-functional installation, which contains Army Forces Command units, human capital commands, as well as a large Reserve unit footprint.

The last of the major BRAC movements to Fort Knox will be the 100th Division's uncasing ceremony at its new headquarters here on Sept. 10. With this news, Fort Knox has successfully completed what is regarded by many as the most complex of the Army's BRAC actions by the mandated deadline of Sept. 15, 2011.

While I've scratched the surface on Fort Knox's transformation, one cannot fully grasp the totality of the changes unless he or she actually visits Fort Knox. Please don't be a stranger; we welcome you anytime and encourage you to use our facilities and attend our ceremonies and events.

We will be hosting our Retiree Appreciation Days Oct. 28 and 29, which provides a great reason to come out to Fort Knox. In addition to the event serving as a great one-stop shop to receive medical screenings, financial and legal assistance, and ID card renewals, RAD is also an event to honor you for your contributions to the Armed Forces – both while in service and upon retirement. Those currently wearing the uniform are indebted to you for helping mold the military into what it is today, and we all offer a sincere 'Thank You!'

IRELAND ARMY COMMUNITY HOSPITAL COMMANDER

The staff and I at Ireland Army Community Hospital look forward to seeing you at the Patton Museum for the 2011 Retiree Appreciation Days. We are proud to serve all those who have given so much to the Nation. Ireland Army Community Hospital (IACH) provides a full spectrum of clinical, laboratory, pharmacy, and imaging services, including Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) and digital mammography. All appointments at Ireland can be made by calling our appointment line at 1-800-493-9602 or through TRICARE Online at <http://www.tricareonline.com/>.

We continue to improve our services and on May 31, we proudly opened the doors to our newly renovated Emergency Department. We expanded the Emergency Room by six beds, so we can now offer 18 beds, including two trauma beds, 10 monitored beds and six rapid treatment beds. The Emergency Room waiting area also features a designated pediatrics area so that children can play with toys while they are in the waiting room.

We've also expanded our parking area to serve you better. You should notice more parking spaces available to you when you visit our hospital, and more are in the process of being constructed.

As always, flu shots will be available at RAD (as always dependent upon timely supply from our vendor who is challenged every year to produce just-in-time the latest vaccine). This year's vaccine will also include immunization against the H1N1 virus. As in past years, we will also provide the pneumonia vaccine at RAD. The pneumonia vaccine is only needed once for those 65 years of age and older. This immunization has the potential to save your life so please plan to receive it if you haven't already. It's also available at our Immunization Clinic, along with the shingles vaccine, Zostavax. Zostavax is given to those 60 years and older who have a prescription.

Please take the time to visit all of our displays and services here at Retiree Appreciation Days and consider our invitation for you to visit Ireland to enjoy our dining facility.

Lastly, please feel free to share your comments with me and my staff. Your input, be it through word of mouth, the customer scorecards or APLSS, helps us to continuously improve. To reach my office, call (502) 624-9070. I look forward to hearing from you, to providing you with the medical services you have earned and to personally thank you for your service to our country.

NOTES FROM THE RSO

The Fort Knox Retirement Services Office (RSO) is located in White Hall (One-Stop), Bldg 1384, Rms 101 & 102. Operating hours are 7:30 a.m.- 4:30 p.m., Monday through Wednesday and Friday. Operating hours on Thursday are 8:30 a.m.- 4:30 p.m. You can contact us by calling (502) 624-1765/7236/6419/4641/4315, or by e-mailing: knox.rso@conus.army.mil. The RSO is designed to assist Soldiers and their Families making the transition to retirement and to keep them updated on their rights, benefits and privileges after retirement. We coordinate, conduct, and facilitate detailed pre-retirement and Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) briefings. We also provide information related to pre-retirement, such as retirement application processing, retirement orders, DD Form 214 (Certificate or Discharge from Active Duty) processing, final out-processing procedures and Career Status Bonus Election (CSB)/REDUX retirement pay option counseling and processing.

We assist retirees and their Family members with Defense Finance and Accounting System - Cleveland issues/concerns, such as allotments, beneficiary information, bank information, tax withholding status, reissue 1099-R for tax filing and requesting copies of the Retired Account Statement. We assist with understanding Combat Related Special Compensation (CRSC) and Concurrent Retirement Disability Payments (CRDP), obtaining copies of lost documents and issuance of military identification cards.

We counsel and assist survivors of retired Soldiers and Soldiers who die on active duty regarding their SBP options and entitlements and the proper processing of the application. The RSO also provides information and assistance to retirees, Soldiers, spouses and former spouses regarding the Uniformed Services Former Protection Act (USFSPA).

Fort Knox has a retiree council that consists of 20 members with a chairman and two co-chairmen. Their mission is to represent the retired military community of all services and grades residing in Kentucky, Illinois, Ohio, West Virginia and Indiana.

We do not make appointments. We operate on a walk-in basis first come first served. We recommend that you arrive at 9:00am or shortly thereafter as our waiting room is frequently crowded by 10:00am. We also insist that you arrive not later than 11:00 to be seen on that day.

We have provided 1392 assists in 2008, 1210 in 2009, 1583 in 2010, and 854 to date in 2011.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS REMOVED FROM ID CARDS

Effective 1 June 2011, DOD ID card policy was implemented to remove Social Security numbers from military identification cards. The change is part of a larger plan to protect service members and other DOD identification card holders from identity theft. Before 1 June 2011, the Social Security number was printed on the back of common access cards and on the front of cards issued to dependents and retirees. The number was also embedded in the bar code on the back of identification cards.

Identification cards will be replaced as they expire and the new cards issued after 1 June reflect a 10-digit DOD identification number in place of the Social Security number. The DOD identification number is a unique number that is assigned to every person with a direct relationship with the department. The new number will also be the service member's Geneva Convention identification number.

An 11-digit number will appear on the cards of those eligible for DOD benefits. The first nine digits are common to the sponsor and the last two digits will identify a specific person within the sponsor's family.

The Social Security number embedded in the bar codes on the back of the cards will remain for now but will be phased out beginning in 2012.

The identity protection program began in 2008 with the removal of Social Security numbers from dependent identification cards. Because the cards will be replaced upon expiration, it will be approximately four years until all cards are replaced with the DOD identification number. Retirees and others that have an indefinite (INDEF) expiration date can go to the nearest ID card facility to obtain a new card.

NATIONAL PRESCRIPTION TAKE BACK DURING RAD ACTIVITIES

Got Drugs? Turn in your unused or expired medication for safe disposal on Friday, October 28 and Saturday, October 29, 2011. The Army Substance Abuse Program at Fort Knox is offering this service to you. Prescription drugs are being misused and abused at alarming rates throughout the United States. As part of the effort to address this problem, the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration will be collecting potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs for destruction at sites nationwide - Fort Knox is one of these sites. MyPay is a website that allows you to make changes to your retired pay, print your 1099R and Retiree Account Statements. You can log onto <https://mypay.dfas.mil/mypay.aspx>. If you do not already have a MyPay account, click to request a new PIN number and one will be mailed to you in 7 to 10 days. Once you receive your temporary PIN number you can log in and change your PIN to a number you choose. MyPay makes it easy for you to view and make changes to your retired pay account without making a phone call or mailing in forms.

RETIRED PAY INFORMATION

Retirees are responsible for updating their file at DFAS-Cleveland within one year in the event that they marry, remarry, are widowed or divorced and need to update beneficiary information and make or update an Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) election. Address changes should also be reported to DFAS-CL to ensure receipt of retired pay, newsletters, 1099R forms and retiree account statements. You may also start, stop, or change allotments and change direct deposit information by contacting DFAS by phone at 1-800-321-1090 or by fax at 1-800-469-6559.
