MINUTES AND ACTIVITY REPORTS

There were 14 military and 14 civilians for a total of 28 present at the 8 AUG 2007 Executive Council Meeting. The minutes of the July 2007 Meeting were approved as presented.

TREASURER'S REPORT

COMMUNICATIONS/REQUESTS

There were no requests presented this month.

GENERAL BUSINESS

AWARDS – It was reported that presentations had been made at all five of the ROTC Leader Training Course graduations.

MEMBERSHIP - Rick discussed the membership report included in the meeting packet. The chapter is up 12 members compared to last month but down 398 from a year ago. Our goal for this year has been set at 1710 and at the current rate it would seem almost impossible to reach without a concerted effort. We must take a proactive approach to member recruiting. We should approach new people coming in over the summer and ask them if they are members. If they are we should ask that they transfer their membership to Fort Knox Chapter immediately. If they are not members we should tell them about AUSA and give them the opportunity to join.

COL. Naething stated that he is still optimistic about membership potential and is looking forward to the opportunity we will have to talk to soldiers after his professional development meeting at the AUSA at Ease on August 24th.

PROGRAMS/ACTIVITIES

*****Chapter Leader Dev Training, August 8-12.** The chapter was unable to recruit someone to participate this year due to scheduling difficulties.

*****AUSA Annual Meeting.** Kendra Stewart advised that rooms have been reserved for the annual meeting to include a hospitality room and anyone needing accommodations' should contact her for assignment of rooms. She will need names to plug into the room reservations as soon as possible. CSM Smith is working on getting the names of the five soldiers the chapter will sponsor and an NCO to act as the coordinator. CSM Smith is also coordinating a team of eight plus two alternates to participate in the ten-miler. The finance committee has suggested that the chapter give \$1000 for the purchase of team uniforms and that those uniforms carry the chapter logo to supplement support provided by MWR. It was thought that Bob Roush is coordinating that with MWR.

*****Next GMM.** The GMM "AUSA at Ease" in August was discussed. It will follow an OPD conducted by COL Naething August 24th at the Leaders Club and be open to members and guests. This will lead into a "Stable Call" that is already scheduled. Roger Stradley, Kendra Stewart and May Giulitto will co-chair.

*****2008 2ND Region, AUSA, Meeting.** The chapter Executive Council voted to host the 2ND Region Meeting on April 24-26, 2008. This will be the 10TH anniversary of the last time that Fort Knox Chapter hosted this meeting having hosted it in 1998. At that time GEN Gordon Sullivan had just taken the reigns of the Association of the United States Army and, the 2ND Region's was the first region meeting that he spoke to.
