## **Executive Council Meeting**

### **ATTENDANCE**

See attached roster. Chapter President Ronnie Pence called the meeting to order at approximately 1200 hours.

**MINUTES AND ACTIVITY REPORTS** - There were 15 military and 13 civilians for a total of 28 present at the 14 May 2008 Executive Council Meeting. The minutes of the April 2008 Meeting were approved as presented.

### **GENERAL BUSINESS**

### **ANNOUNCEMENT**

President Ronnie read a list of AUSA activities/achievements regarding Ruff Warren which lead into remarks by Ruff about the importance of AUSA to him and to Soldiers over the past 50 years. Ruff then informed the council that he was stepping down as AUSA State President for Kentucky and that Rick Lewis had been appointed to succeed him.

**AWARDS** - We have worked 11 JROTC requests for support and will work 6 upcoming LTC cadet graduations in the Jun/Jul 2008 timeframe. Patton and Abrams Awards continue in OSUT, AIT and BCT.

**MEMBERSHIP REPORT** - Rick explained the membership reports included in the meeting packet that showed that 38 individual members had expired and 13 transferred out of our chapter during April. This was partially offset by 11 new members and 15 transfers in for a net loss of 10 members for the month of April.

**LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS** - No report.

**PUBLICITY/NEWSLETTER** - Rick is working on the next edition of our newsletter.

### **PROGRAMS/ACTIVITIES**

**\*\*\*2<sup>nd</sup> Region Meeting, 24-26 Apr 2008.** Rick reported that from all reports the meeting was a tremendous success and thanked all on and off post who assisted in this effort for their participation.

**\*\*\* Armor Conference, 4-8 May 2008.** Rick reported that the chapter did have a booth at this event Monday-Thursday supervised by CSM (Ret) Don Devine who was assisted at various times by Betty Davidson, wife of CSM Chuck Davidson, Rick Lewis and others. This was a great way to get the AUSA before a diverse crowd and talk to Soldiers, contractors, etc. The effort also produced a few new members.

**\*\*\*Hooray for Heroes.** Randy Acton gave a report on planned activities and participants. Rick reported that the chapter would have a booth and that he and Bob Roush were planning to man the booth. He solicited council members to assist and Col Utley volunteered to help. It is expected that other council members who will be at the daytime events working other aspects will also help.

**\*\*\*AUSA Golf Scramble/June 6, 2007.** Ronnie reported that this event was chapter's only fund raiser and that lots of support was needed. He has put together a great committee to work on the several aspects and has separate teams working the communities of Radcliff and Elizabethtown for support. We hope to tap sources that did not provide support last year for a variety of reasons, most prevalent being that they weren't asked!

**\*\*\*Army Birthday Celebration.** The Post will be conducting Organizational Day Activities on 13 June 2008. The chapter will provide the birthday cake and the chapter president will assist the CG in the cake cutting. Kendra will take care of getting the cake. Events will take place at Kilianski Sports Complex beginning with a post run starting at 0600 and the cake cutting at approximately 1200.

## **SUB-CHAPTER VP REPORTS**

**194<sup>th</sup> Bde:** Col Hubner reported that they have approximately 3,000 in training at this time. 46<sup>th</sup> AG will support Hooray and 2/46 will send around 200 soldiers. They are also preparing to participate in Military Appreciation Day with the Louisville Bats where the CG will be throwing out the first pitch. He also invited and encouraged all of the council members to watch the calendar of events and attend their many graduation ceremonies.

**16<sup>th</sup> CAV:** Reported that 233<sup>rd</sup> was getting ready to deploy for the 6<sup>th</sup> time. Some NCOs assigned to this unit have been on all 6 rotations! 16<sup>th</sup> CAV is also at maximum training capacity for the summer while they are preparing to support Hooray for Heroes and Military Appreciation Day with the Louisville Bats.

**Garrison:** CSM Waters reported That Garrison had just completed a very successful Garrison Commanders Conference attended by 12 Garrison Commanders from various posts. He also advised that COL Needham's Change of Command would be on July 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Contractor Affairs:** CSM (Ret) DeSario commented on the Armor Warfighting Conference which he characterized as a tremendous success.

**Retiree/Veteran Affairs:** No report.

Wallace, CDR U.S. Army Training & Doctrine Command. 3) Memorial Day Ceremony will take place at 11:30 am on Monday, May 26 on the Brooks Field Court of Honor, Fort Knox. 4) CSM Stanley, new Armor School CSM welcome on 5/30 at 8:45 at the Gazebo. 5) GEN BB Bell's Retirement will be held on 6/9 and will draw a huge crowd. Invitations are event specific and special plans have been worked out for parking. 6) Army Birthday events on 6/13 (see above in Programs). 7) COL Bayer will be frocked as BG on 6/16, 1400 at the Court of Honor. 8) Community Relations Committee meeting 6/26 at Camp Carlson.

**Other:**

Gene Gudenkauf reported on a group of realtors who would be in the area to provide information and assistance to soldiers faced with relocation in the near future.

**Red Cross Run For Red:** May Giulitto reported that the "Run for the Red", 5-K/10-K Walk/Run was a huge success and that due to sponsorships 51 trainees were able to participate. BG Challenge won the 10-k and the Marines won the 5-k events. Red Cross is also providing goodie bags for deploying Soldiers and will also provide them for the AUSA/ILW Golf Scramble.
